## THE SYNAXARION

On January 18th in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate our Fathers among the Saints Athanasius and Cyril, Patriarchs of Alexandria.

*Athanasius hath died, yet I call him living, for the righteous live, though by death they be taken.  
Today the memorial of the exile of Cyril, but not his ever-memorable death, creation keepeth.  
On the eighteenth buried they Athanasius' dead body.*

These wise teachers of truth and defenders of Christ's Church share a joint Feast in recognition of their dogmatic writings which affirm the truth of the Orthodox Faith, correctly interpret the Holy Scripture, and censure the delusions of the heretics. Athanasius took part in the First Ecumenical Council when he was still a deacon. He surpassed everyone there in his zeal to uphold the teaching that Christ is consubstantial (*homoousios*) with the Father, and not merely a creature, as the Arians proclaimed. This radiant beacon of Orthodoxy spent most of his life in exile from his See, because of the plotting of his enemies. He returned to his flock as he was approaching the end of his life. Like an evening star, he illuminated the Orthodox faithful with his words for a little while, and then reposed in 373. Cyril was the nephew of Patriarch Theophilus of Alexandria, who educated him from his youth. He succeeded to his uncle's position in 412, but was deposed through the intrigues of the Nestorian heretics. He later resumed his See, however. Cyril presided at the Third Ecumenical Council in 431, which censured the Nestorian blasphemy against the Most Holy Theotokos. His wise words demonstrated the error of their false doctrine. Cyril departed to the Lord in 444.

On this day, we also commemorate the Martyr Theodoula of Anazarbus and her companions; and Maximos, the Serbian ruler. By the intercessions of Thy saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.

Blessed art Thou, O Lord, the God of our Fathers.

### The Reading from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Hebrews (13:7-16)

Brethren, remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the Word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through His own blood. Therefore, let us go forth to Him outside the camp and bear the abuse He endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city, which is to come. Through Him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge His Name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.



**“Bethany Houses” for Our Time**  
*By His Eminence Metropolitan Saba (Isper)*

I was compelled to travel earlier than planned, before the meeting of the Holy Antiochian Synod in October of last year (2025), to Lebanon in order to attend to several personal matters—medical and legal—and to bring them to a close. During that time, I was given the opportunity to stay for a period in a retreat house belonging to one of our monasteries there. From it, I would go out to attend to the matters that had brought me, and then return.

That period granted me something I deeply needed: inner calm, through intensified prayer, reading, and walking in nature. I have long emphasized the importance of spiritual retreats. Although my retreat was in a sense forced and mixed with necessary obligations, I nonetheless experienced its benefit, both spiritually and physically.

The Orthodox tradition is well acquainted with frequenting monasteries. Traditionally, spiritual retreats in the Orthodox world consist of spending a few days in a monastery, during which the believer follows the monastery’s daily cycle of prayers. In addition, the elder or abbess assigns a personal rule that includes spiritual reading, a prayer rule, and work.

Since monasteries are unable to receive all the faithful, many parishes in recent years have turned to organizing group spiritual retreats—whether in monasteries, parishes, or nearby suitable locations—where participants spend one or more days in an atmosphere of prayer, reading, spiritual conversation, and shared life. These retreats help people recover something of a return to themselves, granting inner peace and allowing them to taste the joy of Christian fellowship within the family of Christ.

The contemporary human being lives under mounting tension caused by the accelerating pace of daily life and its pressures. Long working hours, economic strain, exhausting commutes, consumerist lifestyles, and constant preoccupation with livelihood concerns—along with many other factors—have led to exhaustion, frayed nerves, loss of inner balance, mental confusion, and depression that has become one of the most widespread illnesses of our age. Medical statistics indicate that sedatives are among the most commonly sold medications.

All of this requires that the Church not limit herself to preaching and teaching alone, but that she accompany them with renewed pastoral ministry and care for the human person, both collectively and individually. This need is one of the reasons behind my call to revive the ministry of the diaconate in our Archdiocese. At the Archdiocese Convention in 2023, I also called for the revival of prayer groups in parishes and spoke briefly about retreat houses.

People today need the Church’s help in organizing short or extended spiritual retreats, taking into account small groups—no more than twenty participants—in quiet, natural settings close to the parish, both to reduce costs and to encourage those with limited means to participate. Participants spend the day in common, quiet prayer. The program should include times for silence, spiritual reading, shared Gospel reflection, discussion around spiritual texts or sayings, as well as silent walks in nature accompanied by the Jesus Prayer.

Such a retreat should not be spiritually burdensome, financially costly, nor merely a recreational activity. The modern person, worn down by nervous strain, needs a period of rest—a kind of spiritual, psychological, and even physical convalescence. Secular spiritual organizations are already offering such programs and workshops. This is all the more reason, then, for the Church to make this ministry one of her top priorities—if we truly desire, and we must desire, to seek the salvation of humanity, for whose sake God became incarnate. Is not salvation the very mission of the Church?

We must not content ourselves with offices for administrative and spiritual appointments alone. I say repeatedly to our priests: I do not want you to be managers of religious enterprises; I want you to be spiritual fathers and shepherds of souls. We must nourish the contemporary human person and help him deepen his life and personal relationship with God. In Christ alone does one find the meaning and purpose of life, and through Him discover the true joy for which the heart longs. A Church whose members do not taste the joy of Christ, purity of life, lived love, and mutual support remains nothing more than a religious association. Christ did not come to establish an association—even a religious one. He did not found a religion; He offered a way of life. The Church is His Body, and His Body is always alive. The Church is a living, vibrant organism, overflowing with life.

When I was Metropolitan of the Archdiocese of Hauran, by God’s grace I was able to acquire a house in one of the most beautiful regions of Syria and transform it into a retreat house, which I named “Bethany House.” Did not Christ Himself go to Bethany, to His friend Lazarus and his sisters, to find rest with them? I intended it to be a place of spiritual, psychological, and restorative renewal for the sons and daughters of that archdiocese who were exhausted by the ongoing war. Very quickly, however, it became a destination sought by believers from various archdioceses. How I wish that some capable and generous faithful would take the initiative to establish retreat houses—“Bethany Houses”—for the people of our Archdiocese here in North America.

I dream that in the near future we will have retreat houses in many areas of the Archdiocese, places our faithful can visit to spend days of joy in the presence of God and one another. In this way, we encourage one another to choose the “good portion” that will not be taken away from us. Encourage one another to provide the Archdiocese with retreat houses—for yourselves and for your children after you.

اضطررت إلى السفر مبكراً، قبل انعقاد المجمع الأنطاكي المقدس في تشرين الأول من العام الماضي (2025)، إلى لبنان لمتابعة بعض الأمور الشخصية، على الصعيدين الصحي والقانوني وإنهاها. وهذا تستنت لي الفرصة لأن أقضي فترة في منسك يتبع لأحد أديرنا هناك. كنت أنطلق منه لمتابعة ما أتيت من أجله وأعود إليه تالياً. منحتني تلك الفترة بعضاً مما كنت أحتجه من هدوء داخلي بسبب تكثيف الصلاة والمطالعة والسير في الطبيعة.

كنت ولا أزال أشدد على أهمية الخلوات الروحية. وعلى الرغم من أن خلوتي كانت قسرية ومشوبة بمتابعة ما اضطررت إلى المجيء من أجله، إلا أنني لمست فائدتها حتى على صعيد نشاطي الروحي والجسدي.

يعرف التراث الأرثوذكسي التردد على الأديرة. والخلوات الروحية تقليدياً، كما ثمارس في العالم الأرثوذكسي، هي قضاء بضعة أيام في الدير. يتبع المؤمن خلالها برنامج الدير من حيث دورة الصلوات اليومية. بالإضافة إلى ذلك يعطيه الشيخ (رئيس) أو الشيخة (رئيسة الدير) برنامجاً شخصياً يتضمن قراءة روحية وقانون صلاة شخصية وعمل.

ولأن الأديرة غير قادرة على استقبال جميع المؤمنين، لجأت كثرة من الرعايا في السنوات الأخيرة إلى تنظيم خلوات روحية جماعية، في الأديرة أو الرعايا أو منطقة قريبة مناسبة، حيث يقضى المشتركون نهاراً أو أكثر في جو من الصلاة والقراءة والأحاديث الروحية واختبار الحياة المشتركة. تساعدهم هذه الخلوات في استعادة شيئاً من العودة إلى الذات، مما ينحهم هدوءاً داخلياً، وينيّهم فرح الشركة المسيحية في عائلة المسيح.

يعيش الإنسان المعاصر توتركاً تزداد حدته من جراء تسارع إيقاع الحياة اليومية وضغوطها. إلى ذلك العمل الطويل والضغط الاقتصادي والمواصلات المرهقة ونمط الحياة الاستهلاكي والانشغال بهموم معاشرة متکثرة، بالإضافة إلى عوامل أخرى كثيرة، أدى إلى إرهاق الإنسان المعاصر وتلف أعضائه وخروجه من ذاته وتشویش ذهنه وإصابته بالكآبة، التي غدت أكثر أمراض العصر انتشاراً. تفيد الإحصاءات الطبية أن الأدوية المهدئه هي الأكثر مبيعاً !!

هذا كلّه يحتم على الكنيسة ألا تكتفي بالوعظ والتعليم، وأن ترافقهما بتنشيط الخدمة الرعوية والاهتمام بالإنسان على الصعيد العام والشخصي في آن. تُعد هذه الحاجة أحد أسباب دعوتي إلى إحياء خدمة الشموعية في الأبرشية. وكانت قد دعوت في مؤتمر الأبرشية في العام 2023 إلى إحياء جماعات صلاة في الرعايا، وذكرت شيئاً عن بيوت الخلوات الروحية


يحتاج إنسان اليوم إلى مساعدة الكنيسة في تنظيم خلوات روحية قصيرة أو طويلة تأخذ بعين الاعتبار اشتراك عدد لا يتجاوز العشرين، في منطقة طبيعية هادئة وقرية من الرعية، تخفيقاً للنفقات وتشجيعاً لذوي الدخل المحدود على الاشتراك فيها. يقضي المشتركون اليوم في صلاة هادئة يشترك الجميع فيها، وينظم البرنامج بحيث يعطي المشتركين أوقاتاً للصلوة والقراءة الروحية، وتأمل إنجيلي مشترك وحوار حول نصوص أو أقوال روحية بالإضافة إلى مسيرة في الطبيعة صامت برفقه صلاة يسوع.

لا تكون هذه الخلوة ضاغطة روحياً، ولا مكافة مادياً، ولا نشاطاً مجرّد ترفيهي. فإنّ إنسان العصر المرهق عصبياً بحاجة إلى قضاء فترة نقاوة أو استجمام روحي عصبي نفسي وحتى جسدي. باتت هيئات روحانية لا دينية تنظم هكذا حلقات أو دورات. لذلك فالألقى بالكنيسة أن تجعل هذه الخدمة من أولى أولوياتها، إن شئنا، ويجب أن نشاء، أن نسعى إلى خلاص البشر الذي تحسد الله من أحلمهم. أليس الخلاص رسالة الكنيسة أساساً؟

يجب ألا نكتفي بمكاتب للمراجعات الروحية والإدارية. أقول لكهنتنا دوماً لا أريدكم رجال أعمال دينية، نريد آباءً روحيين، ورعاية نفوس. علينا تغذية الإنسان المعاصر ومساعدته على تعميق حياته وعلاقته الشخصية بالله. بال المسيح فقط يجد معنى حياته وغاليتها، وبه يكتشف الفرح الحقيقي الذي يصبو إليه. الكنيسة التي لا يذوق أعضاؤها فرح المسيح ونقاء السيرة واختبار المحبة والتعاضد تبقى جماعية دينية لا غير، وال المسيح لم يأت إلى أرضنا ليؤسس جماعية ولو دينية. هو لم يؤسس ديناً، بل طريقة حياة. الكنيسة جسده، وجسده هي، على الدوام. الكنيسة كيان هي، وحيوي يمور بالحياة

عندما كنت مطراناً لأبرشية حوران، استطعت بنعمة الله أن أفتني بيّتاً في أحد أجمل مناطق سوريا، وحولته إلى بيت للخلوة، وسمّيته “بيت عنياً”. لم يكن المسيح يذهب إلى بيت عنياً، إلى صديقه لعاذر وأختيه ليترتاح عندهم؟ أردته مكان استجمام روحي عصبي ترفيهي لأبناء الأبرشية المتعلين من جراء الحرب الدائرة في البلد. لكنه سرعان ما صار مطلاً لكل المؤمنين من مختلف الأبرشيات. كم أتمنى لو يبادر بعض المؤمنين المقدرين إلى إحياء بيوت خلوة (بيوت عنياً) لأبناء أبرشيتنا هنا في أميركا الشمالية.

أحلَمُ بِأَنْ يَكُونَ لَنَا فِي الْمُسْتَقْبَلِ الْقَرِيبِ بَيْوَاتٌ خَلْوَةٌ فِي أَمَكْنَاتٍ كَثِيرَةٍ مِنَ الْأَبْرَشِيَّةِ، يَعُودُهَا مُؤْمِنُونَا لِيَقْضُوا أَيَّامَ فَرَحَ بِصَحَّةِ اللَّهِ وَبِعَصْبَهُمْ. بِذَلِكَ نُشَجِّعُ بَعْضَنَا عَلَى اخْتِيَارِ النَّصِيبِ الصَّالِحِ الَّذِي لَا يُنْزَعُ مِنْهُا. شَجَعُوا بَعْضَكُمْ عَلَى اقْتَاءِ الْأَبْرَشِيَّةِ بَيْوَاتٌ خَلْوَةٌ لَكُمْ وَلِأَوْلَادِكُمْ مِنْ بَعْدِكُمْ




# God's Little Lights

Dear Members of Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Church,

A blessed Nativity Season to you and your families! This is to inform you that the 2026 Annual General Assembly Meeting for the voting membership of Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Church will be held on Sunday, January 18, 2026, following the Divine Liturgy. The agenda is on the reverse side of this letter.

To be recognized as a voting member of Saint George Church, a parishioner must be at least eighteen years of age and have fulfilled both the necessary spiritual obligations (as determined by the Pastor) and the financial obligations (as determined by the Financial Secretary), which require a minimum contribution of \$600 per married couple or \$300 per individual received between January 1, 2025, and December 31, 2025. Each married couple attending the meeting will be given two ballots — one for each spouse in attendance — while individual members, over the age of 18, who have met the requirements, will each receive one ballot from the Financial Secretary at the meeting. Only those present at the meeting may vote; no proxy votes are permitted. If you have not already met your financial obligation, please do so before December 31, 2025. If you are experiencing financial hardship, please see the Pastor. Should you have any further questions regarding these requirements, please contact a member of the Parish Council.

The goal of Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Church is to have all eligible members vote.

At this General Assembly, elections will be held for four (4) seats for a three-year term on the Parish Council. A Nominating Committee has been appointed to compile a list of qualified candidates. The members of the committee are Fr. Fouad Saba, Dn. George Nassief, Mr. Victor Imreibe, and Mr. Michael Moukheiber. If you or someone you know is interested in running for the Parish Council and is willing to make the commitment required to fulfill this important obligation, please contact the Nominating Committee.

It is important to note that pursuant to the Saint George Church Constitution, no nominations will be accepted from the floor during the Annual General Assembly Meeting. All candidates' names must be submitted to the Nominating Committee by Wednesday, January 7, 2026, in order for the candidate's name to be included on the Ballot. There can be no exception to this rule.

During this General Assembly Meeting, all members will also receive a full 2025 Financial Report, the proposed 2026 Annual Budget, and reports from the various organizations and hear about all current plans for the coming year. 2025 was an extremely active year in the life of Saint George Church and your attendance will add greatly to the discussion.

The Church is our spiritual home. Your involvement in the affairs of your Church is very important. May God bless you all as we prepare for the birth of the Savior!



## SEASON OF EPIPHANY

Traditionally, at the feast of the Lord's Epiphany (Baptism) on January 6<sup>th</sup>, the Great Blessing of the waters takes place and then is used to sanctify the homes of all the faithful. In bringing the blessed water to the homes, and sprinkling it in each room, we rid our house of any evil influence, and rededicate it to God in a special way.

As we were once renewed by the waters of our own baptism into Christ, so too our home, and our entire lives, are re-dedicated and renewed unto Christ our God each year at this time.
